FRANK FOWLER



When you start working around a golf course at age eight it's easy to see how golf can become your life. As he grew up Frank Fowler helped his father, the greens superintendent at Mayfair in Edmonton, in everything from mowing to gopher control. Working on his grip and swing as well resulted in junior championships in 1949 and 1950, followed by two Edmonton Amateur Championships.

Frank began his professional career in Alberta, working at Grand Prairie, Red Deer, then Canyon Meadows in Calgary for fifteen years. He excelled in many professional events in the prairie provinces. He finished second in the 1966 Canadian PGA Championship, then partnered with George Knudson at the World Golf Championship in Japan. Frank began a new phase of his career in 1975 by joining the Canadian Tour

where he competed for twelve years. He won the Canadian Senior PGA Championship in 1986, the Saskatchewan Seniors Championship four times from 1994 to 1997, and won the Alberta Senior title twice.

Frank has served as a Director and Vice-President of the Canadian PGA.

Frank Fowler was Head Professional at North Battleford Golf Club from 1982 to 1994, followed by Jackfish Lodge then Chinook in Swift Current. He was a strong supporter of the SGA Junior Golf Program over twenty-nine years and also acted as advisor to the SGA rules committee.

Frank has a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Alberta PGA and honorary Life Memberships in both Alberta and Saskatchewan. In 2002 he was inducted into the North Battleford Sports Hall of Fame. He continues to teach golf in the Battlefords area.
